Dear Friends,

I always enjoy reporting to you, our friends and supporters of the Little White House, of our projects and accomplishments of 2013.

* *

With ever increasing attendance, the public restrooms were simply inadequate for our guests on daily tours and our nightly events. Our challenge, of course, was how to increase capacity while maintaining historic integrity and the added constraints of current ADA requirements. Using the original footprint so as not to alter our historic structure, we doubled the ladies restroom and added a separate ADA restroom.



Since we offer Key West's largest outdoor venue for events we enhanced the north lawns with LED lighting that illuminates both the structure and our gardens creating a sculptural effect. We are so pleased with the effect that we plan to add these lights to both the east and west lawns in 2014.

As stewards with limited resources we applied to our county for tourist development dollars; your donations and memberships served as our match for this \$70,000 project.

We were delighted to continue our educational outreach with both our Presidential Families program and our annual symposium in partnership with the Truman Presidential Library. Each will be reviewed later in this program. Again, your contributions have made these programs possible.

While we are fortunate to be located in a tourist destination, our needs to protect and preserve the Little White House in a tropical climate remain. 2014 will necessitate painting the structure, our most important artifact, as well as treating for an active termite infestation. We have deferred these projects and they must now be done to fulfil our basic core mission of "protecting and preserving the Little White House". The current political trends of Congress have slashed nearly all funding to historic programs. These cuts and governmental agencies still reeling from the effects of sequestration have left us in peril to continue our ability to meet these ongoing needs and programs. I am most thankful for your friendship and continued support of our many projects. I also acknowledge the Little White House will never be "finished" as there will always be restoration needed. Your support remains critical.

The 11th Annual TRUMAN LEGACY SYMPOSIUM The National Security Establisment

The eleventh annual Truman Legacy Symposium was held May 17 and 18, 2013. This year's topic was the Creation of the US Military Establishment renamed the Department of Defense in 1949.

Friday night a panel consisting of Douglas Stuart of Dickinson College, Mark Jacobson of the German Marshall Fund, Mike Devine, Director of the Truman Library and Bob Wolz, Director of the Little White House discussed the formation of the combined armed forces and the Key West Accords that had been signed at the Little White House in March 1948 effecting the merger of the Army and Navy, resulting in the creation of the US Air Force, the CIA and the National Security Council and the framework for the Department of Defense.

Saturday's activities were held at the Conference Center at the Key West Marriott and broadcast on C-Span. Michael Hogan of the University of Illinois and Mary Ann Heiss of Kent State University served as co-chairmen.

Six presentations followed on the creation of the Department of Defense, financing the Armed Forces, the Military Industrial and Academic Complex and the politics of national security to name a few. All are available on C-Spanvideo.org Search under the Truman Little White House for a range of interesting programs.

A special treat was the return of former Congressman Ken Hechler of West Virginia, one of the last two surviving members of President Truman's administration. Ken's presentation was entitled "President Truman and the Five Star Generals: George C. Marshall, Douglas MacArthur, Dwight D. Eisenhower and Omar Bradley". It should be noted that Ken is 99 years old.

The concluding remarks entitled "The Legacies and Lessons of Post-War Defense: Planning in an Uncertain World" were given by Mark R. Jacobson of the German Marshall Fund.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW



Total Income and Expenses of your foundation was \$219,147

These two pie charts are provided to give you, our members, a snapshot of where the Foundation money came from and how it was spent. 36% of our income was earned through site rentals for wedding and corporate dinners, 10% from your memberships, 30% from grants from Monroe County Tourist Development Council, the Truman Presidential Library and from private/ family foundations, 24% from in kind services and donations. Only 3% is received from admissions to our lectures, symposia, etc. These are priced to allow the greatest public participations.

On the expense side, we are mission driven 39% of expenses related to preservation of the house and artifacts, 20% went to educational expenses of creating the presidential families and symposia series, 6% in professional fees, 4% in printing expenses, 31% in membership services and new exhibits.

The operation of the Truman Little White House is totally funded through admissions and museum store profits.

Live Entertainment Comes to the Little White House



The Little White House was pleased to welcome singer/ planist Bobby Nesbitt and singer Carmen Rodriguez to its latest event: The Living Room Series. By day we are a re-creation of the president's office that magically transforms into an intimate 1940's night club for each show

magically transforms into an intimate 1940's hight club for each show. Fours shows of "Moonlight Serenade, the Songs of World War II combined the hits of 1941 to 1945 with reading of soldiers' letters home that shared hope, love, loneliness and sometimes tragedy. These sold-out shows were all memorable. Bobby, well known for his "Bobby in the Lobby" series at Tennessee Williams Theater presented historic background on each of the bit songs of Truman's era from 1945 to 1952 hit songs of Truman's era from 1945 to 1952.

This concluded in the southernmost inauguration events in January 2013 that included a Sunset Cocktail Party at the Southernmost Hotel , the live broadcast of the inauguration on the north lawn of the Little White House the next day and then an all-American picnic lunch. Our members found it great fun to watch the Washington, DC festivities live on the Little White House lawn. The day concluded with the Southernmost Inaugural Ball with live entertainment by Debra and Patrick sponsored by our friends and supporters at the Southernmost Hotel Group, Lilly Pultizer, Tommy Bahama and Milan Events Florals.

The living room of the Little White House was magically transformed into a 1940s cabaret with Bobby Nesbitt and Carmen Rodriguez performing "Moonlight Serenade, Songs of World War II."

Interwoven between songs such as the "Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy" and "The White Cliffs of Dover" were soldiers' letters home, and stories of the home-front. Though the generosity of John and Marilyn Rintamaki, President

John and Mattie Truman's first home was in Lamar, Missouri, a dusty windblown market town and county seat (Barton County). For \$685 John became the proud owner of a corner lot, and a white frame house measuring all of 20 by 28 fect. It had six tiny rooms, no basement, no running water, and no plumbing. But it was new, snug and sunny, with a casement window in the parlor on the southern side.

Their first child, a boy, was stillborn the couple's first autumn in Lamar, Missouri. A year and a half later their second child, another boy, was born in a bedroom off the parlor so small there was barely space for the bed. The attending physician, Dr. W. L. Griffin, received a fee of 515, and to celebrate the occasion the new father clasted a seedling nips in the front yard. A story that Lobo Trums



planted a seedling pine in the front yard. A story that John Truman nailed a mule shoe over the front door for good luck was apocryphal. The date was May 8, 1884.

Not for a month afterward, however, did Dr. Griffin bother to register the birth at the county clerk's office up the street, and even then, the child was entered nameless. In a quandary over a middle name, Mattie and John were undecided whether to honor her father or his. In the end they compromised with letter S. It could be taken to stand for Solomon or Shipp, but actually stood for nothing, a practice not unknown among the Scotch-Irish, even for first names. The baby's first name was Harry, after his uncle Harrison. Harry S. Truman he would be. At President Truman's birthday party in 1948 Secretary of State George Marshall said "The

THE RESTORATION CONTINUES...

All old houses need constant care; add 65,000 visitors walking through our living room and using our restrooms and the task becomes almost overwhelming.

The Little White House opened to the public as a museum in 1991 and more than 1,250,000 visitors have taken the fully narrated tours since and another 750,000 have attended weddings, events, or just visited the free exhibitions. This resulted in a heavy use of our restrooms. In winter, a line to use them often formed. The time had come to expand facilities. As a historic site we are restricted as to what we can do. After careful consultation with engineers, the Historic Florida Keys Foundation, the Florida Department of State Bureau of Historic Resources a plan was conceived that created three restrooms in the space previously occupied by two and capacity was doubled as well. We were also able to add a historically correct hexagonal ceramic tile made for ease of maintenance and a separate ADA restroom.

Our State Land Management Agreement calls for increased use of the gardens and lawns over the next ten years. Our botanical gardens are an integral part of that plan. Following the hurricanes of 2005, our master landscaper Carl Gilley set about to replicate the look and feel of the 1949 gardens that President Truman would have enjoyed.

The Trophia Butterfly Foundation of Key West awarded a \$5000 grant as seed money for the project. Blue Island Irrigation donated a \$28,000 system to feed and water the plants. You and Harry's Girls Auxiliary contributed another \$50,000 for plantings. Our botanical gardens feature more than fifty historic trees, some dating back to 1915, so the additional shrubs complete the gardens. The logical choice was to light these trees showing their beauty as living sculptures.

Phase I of this lighting project lit the north lawn and a second phase in 2014 will light the east and west lawns.

The flashing around our chimneys failed and allowed a lot of water to enter our walls causing some failure of our plaster. Once discovered new flashing was installed and the pitched roofs received a stabilizing coating. This small project cost more than \$10,000 so when money becomes available we will be replacing our 1911 tin shingle roof. The new roofing materials will match the old design to maintain the historic integrity of our structure. The Little White House has been deemed a " building of national historic significance" by the US Department of Interior.
